Serving April 16th Philoxenia is a term that combine two Greek words – philo, a word for love like brotherly love or the Disciple whom Jesus loved, and xenia, a word offering protection and hospitality to strangers. So, philoxenia would be a term for the love of strangers.

Jesus offers the two disciples walking on the road to Emmaus, Cleopas and his companion, the opportunity to provide hospitality to a stranger, i.e. Jesus who was not recognized. They accepted that offer as Jesus appeared to be going beyond the village of Emmaus.

Just as soon as they sat down to break bread together, their eyes were opened and they recognized Jesus, then he vanished. What fears do we have about loving strangers, even to the point of not offering them hospitality?
